From the MOCA Membership Chair

The MOCA was organized to assist the MOC in providing help to our sick and disabled veterans. That remains today as our primary mission. However, membership is the key to our organization being able to continue our support to the MOC in both their and our mission. We started this “THERE IS NOTHING STRONGER THAN THE HEART OF A VOLUNTER” year with 4,785 members in 27 Grands and 166 Auxiliaries. The good news is that 3,994 or 83 percent of our members are paid and considered active and in good standing as of December 31, 2016. Of this total 11 Grands and 81 Auxiliaries have reached or exceeded 90 percent of their goal. We still have a lot of membership work to do, we have stood up 4 new auxiliaries, but, have declared 5 auxiliaries defunct. In addition, we have several other auxiliaries with zero paid membership. Grand Presidents and Grand Membership Chairpersons it is your responsibility to reach out to these auxiliaries not reporting.

Membership certificates will be mailed to the Grands for distribution that have obtained 90 percent of their membership goal.

From the Supreme Sky Pilot

Listen Cooties,

This year our visit to the National Home for the Cootie Christmas Party was particularly significant for Sheila and myself. Watching the gold and red Cootie banner under the Stars and Stripes going up the pole at the Cootie House was one of my proudest moments of my more than 20 years as a Cootie. Our job, as an organization and as individual Cooties, is to support our veterans and their families. It is important that we now have a house with our name on it. Let's do everything we can to continue supporting the National Home, and the Cootie House.



Last time I spoke about the new Sky Pilot/Chaplain reporting program we setup on the Supreme website. A few of you have been using it and I can easily see the good work. Since 1 October 2016, you reported spending 1,115 hours, doing 152 services, requiring you to travel 2,376 miles, and costing \$1,859. This is a lot of work, but it represents less than 10 percent of all our Sky Pilots. Remember I told you at the Supreme Convention this year I wanted to be able to report to the Supreme Commander and C of A all the good work you, our Sky Pilots and Chaplains, are doing. I need you to turn in your reports to make that happen. (If we have any chance of doing that, you need to do your part and turn in your reports.)

We are having another problem you can help me with. I'm sure you know, if you have a member who passes away you need to make a report to your Grand and to the Supreme Chaplain. I get them regularly and, when I can, send out condolence cards from Supreme, offering any help needed. The problem is many of the reports I get are not sent in a timely manner. This means I cannot do anything with them. A card or letter sent when the family and friends are grieving, can be very helpful in healing. But a card sent a month later, when the family has started moving on, just opens old wounds and may do more harm than good. This year I have received two notices which were over six months old. Please help me serve the families of our departed comrades, and submit your reports on time.

I am always honored to serve you, I want to do an even better job, but I need your help. Let's work together.

From the Supreme Surgeon

The Surgeons Prescription

Well Cooties, I trust that you are all Lousy and furthermore Agitated. I just wanted to give you a few helpful tips.

Holidays, stress, post-holidays, even more stress -- who has time for taking care of ourselves? You do! Resolve to follow these eight diet, exercise, and lifestyle tips, and you can be good to yourself this winter - and all year long.

1. Enjoy the Benefits of Yogurt

It's creamy smooth, packed with flavor -- and just may be the wonder food you've been craving. Research suggests that that humble carton of yogurt may:

Help prevent osteoporosis

Reduce your risk of high blood pressure

Aid gastrointestinal conditions like inflammatory bowel disease and constipation

Ready to take home a few cartons of yummy yogurt? When buying think low-fat, make sure the yogurt contains active cultures and vitamin D, and keep tabs on sugar content.

2. Help Holiday Heartburn

Getting hit with heartburn over the holidays? Help is at hand! Try these hints and you can stop the burn before it starts:

Nibble: Enjoy your favorite foods -- but in moderation. No need to heap on the goodies (or go back for seconds and thirds!) Packing your stomach with food makes heartburn much more likely.

Know Your Triggers: Certain foods feed heartburn's flame. Typical triggers include foods full of sugar and fat -- think pumpkin pie slathered with whipped cream. Instead reach for complex carbs like veggies and whole-wheat breads -- or at least share that dessert!

Get Up: Stretching out for a nap post-meal is a great way to guarantee you'll get reflux. Instead, keep your head higher than your stomach -- or keep right on walking, away from the dinner table and out the door. Light exercise is a great way to prevent heartburn.

3. Kiss Holiday Cold Sores Good-bye

Holidays: That busy time for toasting the coming year, savoring seasonal sweets, staying up late -- and cold sores?

If you find you're more prone to cold sores (also called fever blisters) during the hectic holiday season, you may be your own worst enemy. That's because lack of sleep, too much alcohol or sugar, stress, and close physical contact (think auntie's smooches) can all contribute to outbreaks.

So, to help keep your kisser cold-sore-free this year -- or to keep from passing your cold sores to others -- try these tips:

Don't overdo the holiday goodies -- maintain a healthy diet.
Get plenty of rest.
Wash your hands.
Don't share food or drink containers.
Discard used tissues.
Don't kiss on or near anyone's cold sore -- and don't let them near yours!

4. De-Stress with Meditation

The bad weather, the seasonal pace, work: If this time of year has your stress meter spiking, it may be time to close your eyes, breathe ... and get a little repetitive.

Repetition is at the heart of meditation's soothing power. The act of banishing thoughts, focusing on your breathing, and repeating a single word or phrase, fires up your body's natural relaxation response. And meditation can do more than soothe away stress. Research shows it may help lower blood pressure, boost immunity, reduce PMS symptoms, even aid in fertility and the delivery of a new mom's milk.

5. Start a Winter Tradition: Family Workouts

Grandparents are in town, a flurry of kids is underfoot, and you're wondering where you'll find time for a quick winter workout. Here's a thought: Why not get everyone involved with these simple workouts?

Walking: It's suitable for young or old, with a pace that's sedate or speedy. Try these ideas to get the gang on their feet:

Do laps at the mall. If you shop, cart your own packages and then unload them in the car after every store. Disguise the walk as something else. Toss a ball as you stroll, fling a Frisbee, or take the dog to the park. Instead of driving, walk over to your favorite local restaurant.
Take part in a holiday fund-raiser, like the Arthritis Foundation's Jingle Bell Run/Walk

Make the Living Room Your Gym:

When everyone's on the couch chatting, or watching TV -- why not sneak in a little calorie burn, too?

Do crunches: Sit on the edge of the couch, hands gripping the edge at your side, then bend knees, lifting them toward your chest.

Leg lifts: Use the same position as above, but lift your legs straight up, instead of bending them.
Trim those triceps by doing dips off the couch edge.

Build your biceps: Grab a bottle of water or a can of soda and do curls.

6. Eat Locally

Organic may be today's healthy-eating watchword, but don't forget this phrase too: eat locally. Some nutritionists think eating locally may be even more important than eating organically. That's because a vital factor in a food's nutrient profile is how long it took to get from farm to table: A head of locally grown lettuce, for example, may be more nutrient-dense than one shipped coast to coast.

Does this mean you should forgo pesticide-free foods when they're available? No, but it's a great idea to make room on your plate for locally-grown goods too, even if they haven't been grown the organic way. Better yet: Eat locally and organic, when you can.

An easy way to get local -- and often organic -- food on the table: Join a CSA (community-supported agriculture). CSAs help you form a relationship with a local farm, which then provides you with fresh, local produce, even milk, eggs, or cheese. Some also function twelve months a year. Find a CSA near you at LocalHarvest.org.

7. Try These 3 Simple Diet & Exercise Tips

Go Slow: You don't need to do a diet slash-and-burn. If you cut just 200 calories a day you'll see slow (and easy) weight loss. Skip a pat of butter here, a cookie there and you're on your way!

Start Small: Banning junk food from the cupboards or boosting fiber may be your goal, but think baby steps. Switch from potato chips to low-fat popcorn, for example, or toss a carrot into your brown bag lunch.

Just Show Up: Don't feel like working out today? Don those exercise clothes anyway. Still not in the mood? Fine. But chances are good that once you're dressed, you're also motivated and ready to go!

8. Invest in Your Health - Literally

If you have a high-deductible insurance plan, you're probably eligible to deposit tax-free cash into a health savings account (HSA).

HSAs help you sock away savings now for medical expenses later. Open an HSA and each year you can stash \$3,050 for yourself (\$6,150 for a family) -- tax-free. And if you don't use up the balance in your HSA this year, it simply rolls over into the next year, and the next -- and continues to grow tax-deferred. Intrigued? Talk to your human resources department to find out if you're eligible.

Whichever healthy steps you take this year -- eating better, exercising more, saving -- remember they're an investment in you and your future. So follow these steps toward better health -- or take your own. Bank a little more sleep this year. Set aside stressful differences. Stock a healthier pantry. Salt away ... a little less salt. It's your body -- and your future!

MOC SUPREME GENERAL ORDER #2 2016-2017

1. Pup Tents, Districts, Grand's, and Auxiliaries are reminded that they are to file IRS Form 990 within five months and fifteen days of the close of their fiscal year. Units whose income for 2016 was less than \$50,000.00 can elect to file Form 990-N an electronic informational return instead of a paper return. Those units whose income was over \$50,000.00 will still have to file the regular Form 990 or 990-T.
2. Cooties at all levels are reminded that Cootie Sunday this year is 12 February 2017. All Cooties should make special effort to visit our hospitalized Veterans on this date.
3. Pup Tents are reminded that Supreme By-Laws state that Pup Tents shall elect their Shave tails no sooner than 15 January 2017. Election and installation must be completed and the Election Report mailed to Supreme Headquarters no later than 31 March 2017. Pup Tents who cannot fulfill this obligation must have approval of the Grand Commander for extension of the time beyond the deadline. Pup Tents not in a Grand must have the approval of the Supreme Commander to extend the time to elect and install.
4. The Pup Tent Election Report Form is available on the website www.lotcs.org under the heading Forms, than under the heading Pup Tents. Download the Form and fill it out and either mail or e-mail the completed form to Supreme Adjutant and Supreme Headquarters.
5. Notice to all Grand's and Pup Tents. There were several By-Law changes adopted by the 96th Supreme Convention which will affect all levels of the Supreme Organization. If your set of By-Laws are outdated and you need a new set to be in compliance. You can get a FREE PDF version by emailing the MOC Supreme Quartermaster and asking for one or order an updated edition of the Supreme By-Laws through the Supreme Supply Department at a cost of \$12.
7. In accordance with Supreme Policy, all Grand's are to inform Supreme Headquarters of the dates and places of their Grand Scratch so that proper representation may be assigned. Completed forms are to be mailed to Supreme Headquarters no later 31 January 2017.
8. In accordance with Supreme By-Laws Section 308 Paragraph B – The installing officer shall forward immediately after installation, a report, properly signed to the Supreme Adjutant and to the Grand Adjutant where a Grand Pup Tent exists.
9. All suggested by-law amendments and changes to the 2016 By-Laws and Ritual need to be submitted by 15 Feb to Judge Advocate Jerry Constable (electronically or snail-mail) so that there is adequate time to review, coordinate editorial changes (for grammar,


syntax, format) and get them to the Editor for publishing. Please include a name and contact information so that he can contact the correct individual to coordinate with them.

10. All Pup Tents are reminded that ALL continuous members that have failed to pay their dues by 31 Dec 2016 are no longer members in good standing.

11. Information and all necessary forms for the 98th Supreme Scratch to be held in New Orleans, LA, is available on the website www.lotcs.org under the heading Events.

12. The next Cootie Courier will be coming out in April 2017. Any Cooties planning on announcing their candidacy need to have their article in by March.

From the Supreme MOCA Hospital Commissioner

Some hospital chairmen are still not understanding about travel time. It is very simple. Travel time is reported by .25, .50, .75, or whole hour for round trip. (15 minutes = .25 of an hour, 30 minutes = .50 of an hour, 45 minutes = .75 of an hour, and 60 minutes = 1 hour) If it takes 5 minutes to get to the hospital and 5 minutes to get back, that equals 10 minutes round trip which is reported as .25 hours. If it takes 25 minutes to get to hospital and 25 minutes to get back, that equals 50 minutes which is reported as 1 hour. You take the total time and round to the ¼ hour.

If you are shopping for a special hospital visit, make sure you give yourself your project hours for shopping.

Remember it was voted on at Supreme Convention that we get project hours, transportation, and Dollar credit for blood donations. Whole blood (per unit) = \$70.00 + 2 Project hours + mileage, Platelets (1 unit per day) = \$70.00 + 3 Project hours + mileage, Platelets (2 Units per day) = \$100.00 + 4 Project hours + mileage, Plasma (1 Unit per day) = \$70.00 + 2 Project hours + mileage. Make sure this is reported on your hospital report under the person's name and also send it the Blood report with dates, etc.

You must report your Supreme Hospital Donation on a hospital form and send it through proper channels to be counted. Sending me the Form DONATIONS FOR SUPREME PROGRAMS AND COPIES OF CHECKS will not get credit for your auxiliary or Grand for hospital. Several people have sent this form to me. However, it has not shown up on a hospital report.

I want to thank everyone for all their hospital work that they have done so far this year. Remember that the MOCA HOSPITAL REPORT dated January 1, 2017 only includes hours that were reported through November because I receive November hours in December and process them.

If you have a problem with hospital, please use your proper chain of command---member to auxiliary to Grand to District Commissioner to me. If you need to, you can contact me directly. However, please try to solve the problem at each level first.

I want to thank everyone for all the cards, e-mails, phone calls, and prayers for Dave. It has been a hard year especially December. Dave is doing better. However, he now has an internal blood clot filter, oxygen at night, on a walker, and leg swelling from the lymph nodes that were affected by the chemo. He still has his cancer, doing what the doctors say, and trying to keep a positive attitude.

Auxiliary to the Military Order of the Cootie Supreme General Order #2 Series 2016-17

1. **MEMBERSHIP:** Any member not currently holding a 2017 membership dues card is NOT a member in good standing. They cannot attend meetings nor claim hospital hours and are ineligible to be elected or hold an office. Payment of their dues will restore all rights immediately.
2. Auxiliaries not having 10 or more members paid for the current year are no longer in good standing with the Supreme organization. The Auxiliary cannot conduct any business, nor elect and install new officers, until the required number of members has been paid.

10. AUXILIARIES ON ALL LEVELS: Must have their own EIN for the purpose of maintaining their non-profit status under the umbrella of the Supreme Organization. This number is to be provided to the Supreme Quartermaster, 604 Braddock Avenue, Turtle Creek, PA 15145.

11. Bylaws are revised every 5 years. Please submit any resolutions for changes to the Bylaw that you wish to present for consideration at a future convention to PSP Marjorie Johns, 14306 Artic Ave, Rockville, MD 20853-2252.

12. To those who are experiencing illness, we extend the best wishes of the Supreme organization. To those who have lost loved ones, we extend most profound and deepest sympathy. Please ensure ALL the sick and departed members are reported to the Grand Chaplain as well as names are sent to the Supreme Chaplain Patricia Potter, 2633 West Adams, St. Charles, MO 63301.

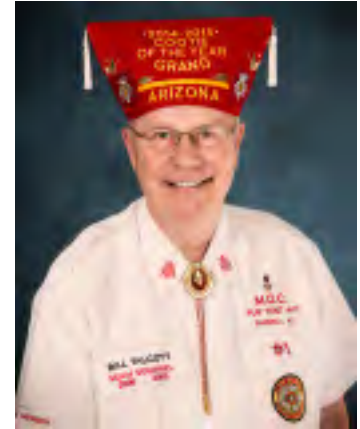

I thought you would like to see what is going on in the Poly-Trauma Ward since the Supreme President's hospital special project is the Poly-Trauma Ward at Hunter Holmes McGuire VA Medical Center in Richmond, Virginia. The majority of patients in the Poly-Trauma Ward were injured in the current conflict and range in ages 18 to 30. Car Bombs are the most common reason for injuries. Several years ago when the VA stood up the Poly-Trauma Wards, McGuire became the leader in treatments for traumatic brain injuries; which includes therapy to teach the disabled veteran how to live independently after leaving the hospital. McGuire asked the Cooties of Pup Tent 14 DA-LEC-ITY and their auxiliary to become the volunteer sponsors of their Poly-Trauma Wards. Normal for Cooties, we have taken on the task and provided funds to buy food so the disabled veteran can

learn how to cook. (For whatever reason, the VA does not fund this). We provide funds for outings and the normal personal care items and entertainment on a bi-monthly basis; which provides energy and satisfaction for the Cooties. At Christmas the Cooties are allowed to provide a Christmas Tree, decorations and gifts for the Ward. Gifts include sports items that the Cooties purchase throughout the year such as ball caps, socks, slippers, tee-shirts and jerseys. It seems every Cootie can find a young veteran that likes the same team as they do. I just wanted to let everyone see the Christmas Tree that we put up this year. The patients are allowed to take the ornaments off the tree so they can use them the next year in their homes. We always try and have ornaments that represent their branch of service.
