

Summertime heat

Now that the hot summer months are upon us, it is important to keep yourself cool and hydrated to prevent heat stroke or heat exhaustion.

Heat stroke is a form of hyperthermia, a condition when your body temperature increases due to inappropriate thermoregulation. Along with high body temperatures, heat stroke is also accompanied with neurological as well as physical symptoms. Heat stroke is a serious medical condition and may require emergency medical aid.

The signs and symptoms of heat stroke are:

--High body temperature --Fast or rapid palpitation --Coma --Seizures

--Respiration difficulties --Hallucination --Poor concentration or confusion

--Agitation or anxiety --Delusion or disorientation --Vomiting --Queasiness

--Headache --Exhaustion --Weakness --Dizziness

--Spasm or aches in muscles --No sweat even under extreme exertion and hot climate;

accompanied with flushed dry skin

Heat Stroke vs Heat Exhaustion

Heat stroke is an unusually high body temperature that includes physical and neurological symptoms. Compared to heat exhaustion, heat stroke is a *real medical emergency* that may be *fatal* if not treated.



MOC General Order #4 2018 - 2019

- 1. 100th Supreme Scratch is to be held in Orlando, Florida at the Doubletree Hotel, near the entrance to Universal Orlando, from the 24th thru the 28th of July 2019. The hotel address is: 5780 Major Blvd, Orlando, Fl 32819. The hotel phone number is (407) 350-1000. Please mention "Cooties" to get the Cootie rate: cutoff date for making reservations is June 28th, 2019
- 2. All Pup Tents are reminded to forward copies of Election Reports for the 2019-2020 membership year to Supreme Headquarters, the Grand Adjutant, the Grand C.C.D.B. and a copy for the Pup Tent records. Pup Tents without election reports for the New Year are not in good standing and may not be represented at either their Grand or Supreme Conventions. Pup Tents whose election reports have not been received by 1 May 2019 may be suspended in accordance with the Supreme By-Laws and can be declared defunct if corrective action is not taken by 01 July 2019. While it is the duty of the Installing Officer to forward election reports, Seam Squirrels, both incoming and outgoing, should take it upon themselves to see that this procedure is carried out. No Election Report = no vote! Please review the latest Inspection Report.
- 3. In accordance with provisions of Section *534* of the Supreme By-Laws, all Pup Tents are required to register, in advance, at least one delegate to the Supreme Scratch. Failure to register shall be grounds for the Pup Tent to be declared in arrears to the Supreme Pup Tent and appropriate action will be taken. Advance registration for the Supreme Scratch is \$15.00 and \$20.00 for registration received after 30 June 2019. No Delegate fee = no vote!
- 4. On-site registration for the 100th Supreme Convention will begin on 24 July 2019.
- 5. Cooties at all levels are reminded that the Supreme Program Book for 2019-2020 administrative year should be available by the Supreme Scratch and on the MOC website https://www.lotcs.org/ shortly thereafter. Care should be taken to secure a copy for further reference throughout the New Year, as there are changes to the Supreme Programs.
- 6. Membership packets for 2019-2020 were mailed on the 5th of June to the Grand Quartermaster of record as provided on the Election Warrant. Grand Quartermasters are instructed to mail out the individual Pup Tent's packages to their respective C.C.D.B.'s. Pup Tents that have not sent in an Election Warrant, or have not secured a Bond for the office of C.C.D.B., or have less than nine (9) members will not receive a packet until these discrepancies have been corrected. If anyone did not receive their package yet, contact Supreme Headquarters.

- 7. The Supreme Commander invites all Cooties at all levels to join us in Orlando to participate in the V.F.W. Patriotic Celebration July 23rd. The uniform will be: Cootie hat, Cootie shirt (any style), and black pants. The Patriotic Celebration takes place Tuesday evening at the convention center with details to follow. Subject to change.
- 8. All Supreme Officers and Chairmen are required to submit in writing a report detailing their activities no later than thirty (30) days before the start of the Supreme Convention. Reports are submitted to the Supreme Adjutant. Deadlines for submitting reports are 25 June 2019.



By-Law Ammendments

B-1

Recommended by the Grand of Ohio Proposed by the Supreme Commander

ARTICLE V – Supreme Pup Tent, Sec. 505 – Supreme Officers

Amend Sec. 505 C. Supreme Council of Administration; by inserting after "(see paragraph A.)", the following:

"current Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars".

B-2

Recommended by the By-Law Committee Proposed by the Grand Commander of Ohio

ARTICLE IV - GRAND COUNCIL OF ADMINISTRATION, Sec. 1 - Grand Council Member

Amend Section 1, Grand Council Member; by inserting after "Past Grand Commanders of Ohio" the following:

"current Department Commander of Ohio of the Veterans of Foreign Wars".

B-3

Recommended by the Grand Council of Administration of South Carolina Proposed by the Grand Commander of South Carolina

ARTICLE VII - Section 701. Uniforms

Insert the following paragraph:

"j. Cootie Bug Collar Pin: Any BUG authorized for sale by Supreme will be considered an authorized device. The collar pin will be worn on the collar in the area between the ears, approaching, but not touching the center of the shirt. The bug should appear to be climbing up the neck. The collar pin can be worn on any shirt, jacket, or coat."

AND Redesignate the current paragraph j as "k."

B-4

Recommended by the By-Law Committee Proposed by the Supreme Commander

The following paragraphs are recommended for amendment to remain in compliance with the By-Laws of the National VFW Organization as amended in 2018 in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order. The amendment is to include the following words: "present and voting" at the location specified by an * in each of the paragraphs identified below:

ARTICLE I – Section 103 – Paragraph B.

An application for membership in the Military Order of the Cootie must be accompanied by a certificate verifying that the applicant has been a member in good standing in the post for the preceding six months, and has completed satisfactory service on a major Post committee or has satisfactorily performed Post duties or participated actively as a leader of Post functions; said certificate enumerating such qualifying service and showing approval of application by a majority vote of the members * at a meeting of the Post shall bear the endorsement of the Post Commander attested to by the Post Adjutant.

ARTICLE II - Section 217 - Paragraph A.

Any Pup Tent may change its name by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership present * at a regular or special meeting called for the purpose, of which meeting and proposed action at least thirty (30) days notice in writing has been given to all members, and provided that such change shall be approved by the Grand Commander and the Supreme Commander.

ARTICLE II - Section 219

When two or more Pup Tents in good standing desire to consolidate, written or printed notice of such proposed action shall be given to all members in good standing at least two (2) weeks prior to date of meeting for consideration of such proposition in each of said Pup Tents. If such proposition shall then be adopted by a vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present * at such scratch, the vote being records by ayes and nays; the fact shall through channels, be certified by resolution of each Pup Tent to the Grand Commander, or if no Grand Pup Tent exists, then to the Supreme Commander. When the resolutions are so approved by two (2) or more Pup Tents, the Grand Commander shall forward said approved resolutions to the Supreme Commander (where no Grand Pup Tent exists, the two Pup Tents shall send them directly to the Supreme Commander) who shall approve or disapprove, depending, and he or she will issue without charge a new Charter reciting the facts of such consolidation and bearing the names of such Pup Tents. The new Charter shall rank from the date of the senior numbered Pup Tent but the number shall be either number of the consolidating units agreed upon by the consolidating Pup Tents, and the new name shall be one agreed on by the consolidating Pup Tents, both of the foregoing having been agreed on by vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the members present * of any and all Pup Tents consolidating at a Scratch for the specific purpose of consolidation, due notice of at least two (2) weeks having been mailed all members of said Pup Tent concerned. The property of the consolidated

Pup Tent shall be conveyed to the new Pup Tent and become the property thereof. All past officers in each shall be entitled to ranks as of date of service in their respective Pup Tent. Upon the consolidation of Two (2) or more Pup Tents, new officers shall be elected and installed. In the event two (2) or more Pup Tents consolidate, all officers of the consolidated Pup Tents having fulfilled their obligations shall be recognized as past officers, provided, however, the past Seam Squirrels of the consolidated Pup Tents for the purpose of representing either the Pup Tents consolidated, or for the new Pup tent formed by such consolidation at any District or Grand Scratch.

- ARTICLE III - Section 307 - Paragraph B

A Pup Tent at a regular scratch, if notice of intent to do so has been given at a prior scratch, may by two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present *, declare vacant the position of any elective officer who has absented them self from two (2) consecutive scratches or has failed to fulfill the duties of that office. No Pup Tent member may bring a motion before any Pup Tent meeting to vacate any elective office unless written notice of the proposed action has been given to the officer holding such office, the Seam Squirrel, the Hungry Cootie and the Grand Commander at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting. The notice shall state the reasons for the proposed action. At the meeting, the officer shall be advised of the facts underlying the proposed action and afforded the opportunity to present evidence on their own behalf.

ARTICLE III – Section 333

Any former member of the Military Order of the Cootie may become reinstated in the Pup Tent to which they formerly belonged upon their re-instatement in the Veterans of Foreign Wars providing such member shall have paid their dues in the Veterans of Foreign Wars. This reinstatement is subject to two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present * of the Pup Tent at any regular meeting.

RITUAL AMENDMENTS

R-1

Recommended by the Grand Council of Administration of South Carolina Proposed by the Grand Commander of South Carolina

The guidelines and instructions within the Ritual conflict with those specified in the By-Laws. Therefore, propose that <u>BOTH</u> INSTRUCTIONS TO SEAM SQUIRRELS, page 5, Paragraph 5, and 1ST DEGREE INSTRUCTIONS TO SHAVETAILS, Page 14, Paragraph 3, read as follows:

"Pup Tent Shavetails shall hold a Scratch once every month and plan the Pup Tent activities for the next month or specified period; and give this information to all members of the Pup

Tent. This will build up membership and keep the members active in the Pup Tent."

R-2

Recommended by the By-Law Committee Proposed by Pup Tent 83, Grand of Ohio

To remove any gender bias in the Opening Prayer adjust the prayer on Page 8 to read:

"O Thou Great and Eternal God, We are reminded there are times of sorrow and of joy, times when we should be quiet and times we should be heard. We would pray Thy blessing on our beloved military order.

In these days of great concern, help us to assert ourselves when we should and to accomplish our purposes without offense to our fellowmen. Give us the insight we pray Thee to have all concern for sick comrades not only by material giving but also showing concern by praying for them and their dependents.

As we look to the days ahead, may we by our faithfulness to the VFW advance its cause and programs and by so doing also advance our cause. May we serve our beloved order and our **comrades** in such a way that we will receive eternal life as our reward, so help me God.

Amen."

Recommended by the By-Law Committee Proposed by Pup Tent 83, Grand of Ohio

To remove any gender bias in the National Home Prayer adjust the first prayer on Page 34 to read:

"Almighty God, we ask Thy Divine blessing on the **dependents** and children in our National Home. May Thy Divine spirit be within them forever, giving them health and guiding their lives. Trust us always, to honor our departed comrades. Amen."

When images from the Past Haunt Us

Did you know that Soviet and Russian cosmonauts took survival kits into space? It's true. These kits included (among other items) high-energy food, signaling mirrors, fishing line and hooks, snow shoes, and a combination shotgun-pistol-machete.

Why would cosmonauts need such things in space? They didn't. These survival kits were intended for life after their spacecraft landed. You see, according to Soviet operational procedure, cosmonauts were to land in the desert of Kazakhstan. But even when things went well, the returning cosmonauts might be in danger from hostile tribesmen or rebels. To make matters worse, sometimes the cosmonauts landed hundreds of miles off course, into Siberia where they were harassed by bears, wolves, or severe weather.

It's somewhat sad and disturbing that the cosmonaut might survive the harrowing journey into space only to perish at the hands of a wild beast, a hostile national, or exposure and hypothermia. It doesn't seem right that, after enduring space travel and risking their lives for their country, that they should have to fend for themselves against the elements.

I couldn't help comparing this to the many redeployed soldiers and veterans who have survived firefights and helicopter crashes in Iraq and Afghanistan, only to die from high risk behavior at home. It reminds me of those thousands of veterans who remain tortured by nightmares, guilt, anxiety, and depression long after they've returned home and separated from the service.

Why is it that the horrific images remain with us and not the pleasant ones? Why is it that after those "long stretches of boredom punctuated by moments of terror," it's the "moments" that come back to haunt us?

I don't have satisfactory answers to those questions. Perhaps those life-threatening experiences destroyed our sense of invulnerability and confront us with our own frailty and mortality. Those are hard lessons that normally require a life-time to learn. But when we face terror and trauma, the process is accelerated a thousand-fold. Instead of a stream of BBs, we're hit with a cannon ball. And it's far too much to process in a short time. Counseling, support groups, and doctor-prescribed medication can certainly help a sufferer find their way to the new normal and growth.

But there is a place of ultimate relief, healing, and growth. It's in the loving arms of Jesus, who has suffered all the pain, anxiety, and death of this life. Jesus will give a redemptive purpose and meaning to the pain and anxiety that haunts you. He turns our curses into blessings and our scars into stars (Genesis 50:20; Deuteronomy 23:5; Romans 8:28-29). He transforms our pain into a redemptive force that drives us into God's embrace and makes us

fit for life and heaven above.

Don't try to self-medicate with drugs, alcohol, or other high-risk behaviors. Don't allow your pain to drive away all those who love you. Flee into the loving arms of Jesus. He will heal you and save you. Do as the old hymn tells us.

"Come ye sinners, poor and needy, weak and wounded, sick and sore. Jesus, ready, stands to save you, full of pity, love, and power.

"I will arise and go to Jesus. He will embrace me in His arms. In the arms of my dear Savior, Oh, there are ten thousand charms."

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, into Your loving and healing embrace I flee. Heal my wounds and calm the storm that rages within me. Breathe into me the breath of life and renew my strength. May I cease to spew poison from a pain-filled heart. But make me an instrument of Your peace, healing, and blessing to others. Amen.


