

From the Supreme Surgeon

FLU SEASON

he flu season is upon us. Here are some things you must know about the 2019-2020 flu season.

- 1. **Symptoms:** Flu symptoms include chills, fever, achy muscles, cough, sore throat, and headache. Flu symptoms can develop suddenly and severely. These symptoms range from mild to severe.
- 2. **Risk Factors:** Flu risk factors include children younger than 4; adults older than 65; living in a nursing home or long-term care facility; currently pregnant or up to two weeks postpartum; weakened immune system; chronic illness or have a body mass index 40 or higher.
- 3. **Colds vs. Flu:** A cold is milder than the flu and comes on gradually. Most cold symptoms occur above the neck, while flu symptoms impact your whole body.
- 4. **Diagnosis:** The most common way to diagnose the flu is the rapid influenza diagnostics test. Your Physician will swab the back of your nose or throat and check the sample for antigens. The results will be available in less than 30 minutes.
- 5. **Treatment:** The flu is treated with an antiviral such as Tamiflu or Relenza. If these treatments are taken within two days of the onset of symptoms, these can lessen symptoms and decrease the length of time you may be sick. Whether you are treated with medications or not, the best way to treat the flu is rest, drink fluids and use any other remedies that best alleviate the symptoms, such as pain reliever for headaches and achy muscles.
- 6. **Prevention:** The best way to prevent the flu is to get the flu vaccine. The injection protects against the three or four flu viruses that research determines will be the most common that year. Despite popular theories, the vaccine cannot give you the flu. Practicing good hygiene, such as washing your hands, coughing or sneezing into a tissue, avoiding crowded areas, avoiding touching your eyes, nose and mouth and cleaning and disinfecting surfaces and objects, can also decrease your risk of catching the flu.

Remember to get your flu vaccination this year, especially if you are visiting patients in the hospital. You can get your flu vaccination through your physician or at most pharmacies.

Please take care of yourself this flu season. If you feel that you are experiencing symptoms of the flu, get to your physician right away.


I am working on a Clown training PowerPoint and would like to use some of your pictures in it.

MOC Supreme General Order #2 2019 - 2020

- 1. Pup Tents, Districts, Grands, and Auxiliaries are reminded that they are to file IRS Form 990 within five months and fifteen days of the close of their fiscal year. Units whose income for 2019 was less than \$50,000.00 can elect to file Form 990-N; an electronic informational return instead of a paper return. Those units whose income was over \$50,000.00 will still have to file the regular Form 990 or 990-T.
- 2. Cooties at all levels are reminded that Cootie Sunday this year is 16 February 2020. All Cooties should make special effort to visit our hospitalized Veterans on this date.
- 3. Notice to all Grand's and Pup Tents. There were several By-Law changes adopted by the 100th Supreme Convention which will affect all levels of the Supreme Organization. If your set of By-Laws are outdated, you need a new set to be in compliance. You can get a FREE PDF version by emailing the MOC Supreme Quartermaster and asking for one, or order an updated edition of the Supreme By-Laws through the Supreme Supply Department at a cost of \$12.
- 4. In accordance with Supreme Policy, all Grand's are to inform Supreme Headquarters of the dates and places of their Grand Scratch so that proper representation may be assigned. Completed forms are to be mailed to Supreme Headquarters no later 31 October 2019. Grands are reminded of the request to send the Supreme Adjutant a copy of your General Orders and/or list of events. The Supreme Commander and Officers wish to be more visible and possibly send a representative to your function.
- 5. In accordance with Supreme By-Laws, Section 534, and having failed to register at least 1 delegate, the following Pup Tents are in arrears to the Military Order of the Cootie of the US and subject to suspension if not received by Nov 30, 2019: AR 03, CA 34, NC 08, 57, OH 04, PA 38, SC 09, TN 04, WI 08.
- 6. In Accordance with Supreme By-Laws Section 308, and having failed to submit an Election Report, the following Pup Tents are considered suspended until such report is submitted to Supreme Headquarters: CA 23, 34, IA 16, OH 04, PA 38.
- 7. In accordance with Supreme By-Laws, Section 314(G) and 413(F) maintaining a current Bond, the following Grands & Pup Tents do not have a valid Bond: AR 03, 14, 21, CA 07, 34, 38, DE 01, FL 02, 55, 57, 66, 75, GA 05, IA 06, 16, KS 07, MA 14, MT 11, NV 05, NJ 07, 39, NY 42, 65, NC 79, OH 04, 24, 25, 86, 118, OR 24, PA 38, 48, SC 03, SD 12, TX 60, VA 05, 11, WI 08, 14, 21.
- 8. In accordance with Supreme By-Laws, the following Pup Tents Charter has been revoked or declared Defunct; MA 34, MD 25, NJ 28.
- 9. All suggested by-law amendments and changes to the 2019 By-Laws and Ritual need to

be submitted by 15 Feb to the By-Laws Review Chairman Mark Larkin (Mark.Larkin1966@ gmail.com or snail-mail). Chairman Larkin will in turn forward to all appropriate Board members. Deadline is so that there is adequate time to review, coordinate editorial changes (for grammar, syntax, format) and get them to the Editor for publishing. Please include a name and contact information so that he can contact the correct individual to coordinate with them.

- 10. All Pup Tents are reminded that ALL continuous members that have failed to pay their dues by 31 Dec 2019 are no longer members in good standing.
- 11. As soon as finalized, information and all necessary forms for the 101st Supreme Scratch to be held in Reno, NV will be available on the website www.lotcs.org under the heading Events.


Auxiliary Members,

Auxiliary to the Military Order of the Cootie General Order #1 Series 2019 - 2020

- 1. Having been duly elected and installed as Supreme President of the Auxiliary to the Military Order of the Cootie I hereby assume the duties of the office.
- 2. All previous appointments are hereby declared null and void.
- 3. **Bonds:** All Auxiliaries and Grands must bond their President and Treasurer by August 31, 2019. Per the By-Laws change adopted at the July 2019 Convention in Orlando. This means you will now have 2 bonds and pay the premium per \$1,000 as outlined on the bond form.
- 4. **Membership Kits:** If you have not received your membership kits, please make sure Supreme has received your 2019 2020 election reports. Please send a copy of your election report to the Supreme President and Supreme Treasurer.
- 5. **Dues:** Auxiliary Treasurers, please remember to send all dues and transmittals to the Grand Treasurer as soon as you receive them. Grand Treasurers, please make sure all dues and transmittals are mailed to the Supreme Treasurer as soon as you receive them. Please do not hold any dues or transmittals. All dues are due to Supreme Treasurer by December 31, 2019 to be a current member on January 1, 2019. Remember VFWA dues are to be paid first.
- 6. **Bylaws and Rituals:** Please make sure you purchase a new Bylaws and Rituals manual due to changes that were made at Supreme Convention.
- 7. **Hospital Pins:** Please turn over all **100 hours hospital pins** to Hospital Commissioner Janis Wimmer in order to receive your next hospital pin. If you do not turn in your 100 hours hospital pin, then you must pay \$5.00. Failure to do so will result in you not receiving your next earned hospital hours pin.
- 8. **Chaplains:** Please send your monthly report to your Grand Chaplain. *Auxiliaries not ina Grand* please send those reports to our Supreme Chaplain. *Grand Chaplains* please send your monthly report to our Supreme Chaplain, with a copy going to your Supreme District Chaplain. It is important that we send cards to our members. Please report any deaths of members to not only our Supreme Treasurer, Penney Howard but to our Supreme Chaplain, Cathy Seippel.
- 9. **Hospital Chairmen:** Please send your reports to your Grand Chairman. *Grand Chairmen:* Please compile the reports & send them to the District Hospital Commissioner. *Auxiliaries not in a Grand:* Please send your reports to your District Hospital Commissioner. 2019-2020 Hospital forms are on the website www.lotcs.org. Supreme Hospital Commissioner, Janis Wimmer, asks that every Auxiliary use the new forms.
- 10. **Supreme President Special Project:** Susan Cihlar is the new chairman for this program. Updated forms and Susan Cihlar's information will be updated on the website.
- 11. **Tomb Trek Official Auxiliary Uniform:** MOCA Uniform should be a white shirt/blouse that buttons to the neck of good quality permanent press or cotton broadcloth; to be worn with pants or skirt of similar material. The length of the skirt (A-Line or straight skirt) shall be no shorter than one (1) inch above the knee and no longer than four (4) inches below the knee. Pants should be of dress quality (NO tights or Jeans). The length of the pants should cover the top of the shoe. Only white shoes with low heels will be worn at Tomb Trek due to the fact that wreaths are presented on turf and walking in heels would be a detriment to your safety. A red blazer type jacket will be worn over the uniform with no patches or pins on the jacket. Ties should be a "Colonel Sanders" type of tie or solid

dress red tie. The MOC Tie with embroidered Cootie is acceptable. All ties will be worn with shirt buttoned at the neck, MILITARY Style. Jewelry will be held to a minimum. NO HOOP or dangling earrings and NO NOSE or LIP rings. The red and white garrison cap or pillbox hat is required and should reflect your most recent position. Examples are online on the MOCA MART. Remember, if it would not be acceptable as a Military uniform, it is not acceptable at TOMB TREK.

- 12. **Secretaries on all levels:** Please forward any changes of officers and addresses to the Supreme President, Supreme Secretary and Supreme Treasurer.
- 13. **Grand Presidents and Supreme District Presidents:** Please remember the Supreme Representative Request Form is due to the Supreme President by December 31, 2019. Please get them in on time.

VALHALLA RANCH FOR VETERANS WITH PTSD

The vision for Valhalla Ranch is that it will be a place where veterans and their families can gather for retreats, help in dealing with their everyday fight with PTSD. Valhalla Ranch is a 501c3. They offer a safe place for veterans who suffer from severe PTSD and in doing that they offer some time away from the real world. Often veterans get more frustrated with official counseling which only brings back the horror and makes the nightmares even worse. Valhalla exists to provide connection, purpose, and hope to veterans and their families, so they can experience the joy of a purposeful life. To reach this end, Valhalla will equip, motivate, and assist veterans and train mental help providers to work with the veterans. It costs \$150.00 to train one veteran in Suicide Intervention. Please help make this a successful project to help our veterans who are suffering every day with the nightmare of PTSD. Donations for this part of the program; payable to Supreme MOCA and earmarked SPSP-Valhalla Ranch; will be sent to our Supreme Treasurer; Penney Howard no later than April 30, 2020. In-Time Donations of \$25.99 are needed to qualify for a certificate.

ADOPTION OF A VETERAN WITH PTSD RESIDING IN ANY MEDICAL FACILITY OR RECEIVING HOME CARE

Please contact any Medical Facility and request a veteran to adopt. Adoption of a veteran in a medical facility should be reported on a MOCA hospital report form with "SPSP" noted in the Information Column. Copies must be attached to your Year End Report.

Projects done when adopting of a veteran in home care should be reported on your Year-End Report, but hours, mileage and funds spent is only reportable to the VFWA Veterans and Family Support Program.

Provide items to make a veteran's day easier. Send cards on their birthday and on holidays. If working with a medical facility, arrange to set up an account for them to purchase items in the facility's canteen. Provide them with socks, slippers, toiletry items, new PJ's, snacks... Use your imagination and work with the staff of the home care team or the medical facility to meet the veteran's needs. Let our veterans know they are not forgotten.





here is a nation whose people are statistically the most generous people on earth.

Never forget. America remains a prayer of hope on the lips of the oppressed.


