Please read the Supreme Program Book as several of our programs have changed and new programs will be available.


We have a large number of Grands that made All Star this year because of their hard work. All Star awards will be given out during the joint opening ceremonies.

Signs of a Stroke

Strokes are the number 5 cause of deaths and the leading cause of disabilities.

A stroke occurs when blood flow to the brain is blocked. Without blood, brain cells die. That affected section of the brain starts breaking down and brain functions are altered. Strokes are usually painless, however there are signs that you may be having a stroke.

Listed below are several ways to determine if you are possibly having a stroke.

Use the letters in **F.A.S.T.** to spot a stroke.



- **F** = Face Drooping. Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven?
- **A = Arm Weakness.** Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one are drift downward?
- S = Speech Difficulty. Is speech slurred?
- T = Time to call 911

Watch for sudden occurrence of the following symptoms:

- Numbness or weakness of face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Confusion, trouble speaking or understanding speech
- Trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- Severe Headache with no cause.

It is hard to tell if you are having a stroke if these are the only signs. But if they appear out of the blue and are strong enough to make you take notice seek help. *When in doubt, get it checked out!*

And that's the other thing. I hope to see each of you in Kansas City. Be safe and be a blessing to others.





Proposed By-Law Changes

B-1

Submitted by Pup Tent 3 through the Grand of North Carolina

Section 201. Formation of.

A Pup Tent maybe formed by charter from the Supreme Pup Tent on application of not less than fifteen (15) members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. These members can be new members, reinstated or transfers from another Pup Tent in accordance with section 101 of the MOC Bylaws: Provided, however, the number of Pup Tents in any Grand shall be governed by a majority vote of the Grand Council and where no Grand Pup Tent exists, it shall be a decision of the Supreme Council. Such application shall be made in accordance with the Bylaws of the Military Order of the Cootie.

Suggested Revision

Section 201. Formation of.

A Pup Tent maybe formed by charter from the Supreme Pup Tent on application of not less than fifteen (15) members of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. These members can be new members, reinstated or transfers from another Pup Tent in accordance with section 101 of the MOC Bylaws: provided, <u>a minimum of 45% of the Chartered members</u> <u>are new members or a minimum of seven (7) of the chartered members must be new members.</u> However, the number of Pup Tents in any Grand shall be governed by a majority vote of the Grand Council and where no Grand Pup Tent exists, it shall be a decision of the Supreme Council. Such application shall be made in accordance with the Bylaws of the Military Order of the Cootie.

Rationale

The idea if instituting a new Pup Tent is to "Increase and Multiply". However, the current wording of the By Laws allows a new Pup Tent to be formed with nothing but transfers. Therefore, negating "The First Great Duty of all True Nits" to "Increase and Multiply" as stated in the opening ceremonies of the Ritual. Also, this could potentially cause irreparable damage to one Pup Tent simply to create a new Pup Tent, thus defeating the intent for starting a new Pup Tent.

Furthermore, pursuant to Section 201 of the VFW By Laws, forming a new Post requires 25 people, 10 of which must be NEW members. This clearly establishes an intent of growing the organization through creation of a new unit. The Military Order of the Cootie, as the Honor Degree of the VFW should follow this notion by establishing a minimum standard as well. A percentage format would allow for a sliding scale in cases where there are more than 15 members desiring to form a new Pup Tent.

A member at large in good standing may become a Life Member by payment of the proper fee to the Supreme Quartermaster if they hold a valid VFW Life Membership.
 - **3)** The applicable fee from the Life Membership fee schedule set forth herein will be determined by using the applicant's attained age as of December 31st of the calendar year in which the application is submitted regardless of the actual date of birth.

Rationale

The purpose of this submission is to clarify the current requirements for Life Membership. The requirement for Life Membership in the VFW is currently specified in Paragraph B of Section 120 regarding Plan "B" Life Membership. As Plan "B" has been closed, this has created some questions as to if that requirement still exists. This change to include this requirement under Plan "C" should eliminate any uncertainties.

The LMC shall make recommendations to the Supreme Council of Administration as to the amount of the proposed annual rebate for the Pup Tents, Grands and Supreme Headquarters.

Suggested Revision

Remove Entire Paragraph

B-8

Section 607. The Visit to the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier:

As reads:

The time of this event, beginning in the year 1971, shall be selected by the Supreme Commander on a date as close as possible to Veterans Day as is determined to be appropriate. The Supreme Commander shall appoint the 4th Supreme District as the Host for the event commencing with the 75th Trek in November 2009. The 4th Supreme District shall continue utilizing a Tomb Trek Committee to plan, coordinate and fund all future Tomb Trek events. It shall be the duty of the 4th Supreme Council Member to see that all plans are made and carried out, including the proper policing of the affair. An audited summary financial report shall be submitted to the Supreme organization within 60 days after the event. Full advance information of the affair shall be placed in the Cootie Courier.

Recommended to read:

The annual visit to the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, known as Tomb Trek, shall be the responsibility of the Supreme Quartermaster. After coordination with Arlington National Cemetery staff, this event should take place on a date as close as possible to Veterans Day. The Supreme Quartermaster or Assistant Supreme Quartermaster may assemble a committee, to plan, coordinate, and carry out administration of this annual event. A summary financial report shall be submitted to the Supreme Trustees within 60 days after the event. Proper advance notification of the affair shall be announced in the annual Military Order of the Cootie Program Book.

Rationale:

After the dissolution of the Supreme Districts and the conclusion of the 86th Tomb Trek, responsibility for the administration of this annual event falls on the Supreme Quartermaster since primary duties require collection and disbursement of funds, obligating the organization through contracts, and coordination with external agencies.

Changes to the Supreme Ritual

NOTE: There were a large number of suggested changes – none of which were substantive, but rather to adjust language for gender neutrality and to provide clarification. Due to the changes being through the document, it is not feasible to include within the Courier. The Supreme Judge Advocate will coordinate the best way to get the proposed changes out for review in a separate mailing to remain within the guidelines of the Supreme By laws.

Memorial Day Message

here's an old biblical passage which has profound relevance for this observance of Memorial Day. In the book of 2 Samuel, chapter

23, we read about the exploits of King David's mighty men. These mighty men were elite soldiers in Israel's army who distinguished themselves by exceptional valor in combat.

But among their exploits is one that seems out of place. It's the account of David's top three mighty men who overheard him say, "Oh that someone would bring me water from the well of Bethlehem" (2 Samuel 23:15). Now Israel's archenemy, the Philistines, had established a garrison in Bethlehem, David's hometown, and it was heavily guarded (2 Samuel 23:14). So, David couldn't have been serious about wishing for someone to bring him water from Bethlehem's well. He knew such an effort was suicidal. David was merely voicing a complaint about his thirst.

Yet these three mighty men were so eager to

please David that they broke through the Philistine ranks in a fierce fight, drew water from Bethlehem's well, and fought their way back to bring it to David.

This selfless and valiant act so deeply moved David that he considered the water they brought him far too sacred to drink (2 Samuel 23:17). In David's mind, to merely guzzle it down to satisfy his own thirst would be a dishonor to the men who risked their lives to get it. To David, the heroism of his men had made the water holy, fit only for a divine and lofty purpose. So, David offered their gift to the only One worthy of it – God Himself - and poured it out on the altar of God as a drink offering. David honored that for which his men had risked their lives.

In November of 1863, President Abraham Lincoln expressed the same logic and sentiments at the Gettysburg Battlefield in his famous Address. To the soldiers and statesmen who gathered on that battlefield to dedicate a portion of it as a national cemetery, Lincoln made this point. He reminded them that the ground where more than fifty thousand Americans had fallen was already dedicated, sacred, and holy. He explained, "We cannot dedicate, we cannot consecrate—we cannot hallow—this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it far above our poor power to add or detract." Lincoln

explained that the very ground beneath their feet had become sacred by the heroism and blood of those who fought to preserve our nation.

If that was true for the hallowed ground of Gettysburg, i sn't it also true for the whole of America, for its flag, its National Anthem, its freedoms, and the values of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness? Haven't the three million killed and wounded Americans from 1775 to this present day, who died that we might live – haven't they consecrated these values, our flag, and our entire nation? Hasn't their blood made these things sacred, and doesn't it justify our patriotism and passion for America?

Patriotism – love for our country and zeal for its Constitution – is the most appropriate response to the sacrifices and heroism of the men and women in uniform who've preserved this great nation. We honor our fallen service members by honoring and preserving that for which they died. For every Soldier, Sailor, Airman, Marine, and Coastguardsman, has taken an oath to support and defend the Constitution against all enemies, foreign and domestic. Therefore, we honor their sacrifice by guarding our Constitution and embracing patriotic feelings.

Our patriotism is essential to preserve America. Patriotism inspires us to cherish those freedoms which were bought with the blood of our brave men and women in uniform. A people who are zealous for their country cannot be easily conquered. This is why those in America who bash our country always condemn patriotism as fascism. They attack patriotism because it inhibits their ability to gain control over America. Indeed, patriotism is a safeguard against all forms of tyranny and dictatorship.

But has America lived up to the worth our fallen warriors placed upon it? I believe that the terrible price our brave warriors paid for this great land has not been in vain. For the America for which they died remains the greatest, the most caring, and the most generous nation in the history of the world.

Just consider, for a moment, the generosity of Americans. America's giving to charity amounted to \$471 billion in 2020. This exceeds the GDP of 166 of the world's 190 nations. But even this pales in comparison to those who gave their lives that America might live on to bless the world.

Consider another sign of America's goodness. Americans adopt more orphaned and abandoned children from abroad – regardless of their race, ethnicity, or color - than any other nation. In fact, several million of its citizens, 18 years and younger, were born in other countries but were adopted by the loving people of this most compassionate nation. This awesome tradition began when returning WWII veterans brought back stories of suffering and abandoned children in Europe and Asia. American families opened their hearts to welcome these victims of war into their own homes.

And although America's military is the most powerful in the world, it does not fight wars of

conquest, but only to deliver the oppressed and defend the helpless. And even though its Army wields devastating power, its soldiers find their greatest satisfaction bringing relief to the victims of catastrophe, performing humanitarian operations, and delivering clothing and toys to children.

Yes, America is so attractive to the outside world that its borders must be guarded. But it's not to keep its own people from escaping, but to control the flood of immigrants hungry for its limitless opportunities for a better life.

This world would be a woeful place without America. Who else but America stands ready to check the aggression of Russia and China and the terrorism of Iran? Fortunately, God has raised up men and women with the courage, selflessness, and dedication to fight for America's survival and success.

Not all Americans can do what they have done. In fact, only a small portion of the population will ever qualify to wear the uniform, deploy overseas, and wage war in a combat zone. But all Americans can and must honor their sacrifices and the nation for which they died. In the words of Abraham Lincoln,

"It is for us the living, ...to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us -- that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion -- that these dead shall not have died in vain -- that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom, ...that government of the people, by the people, and for the people shall not perish from the earth."

If we would honor America's fallen warriors, then let's pledge ourselves to that cause for which they died. Let's love the country they fought to defend. Let's honor the flag under which they served. And let's comfort and support the grieving families they've left behind.

And we owe it to their successors, today's generation of American warriors to whom the torch of freedom has been passed, to thank them for their service and support them with our prayers. Let's pray for them that God will keep them physically strong, morally straight, and spiritually fit. Let's pray that God Almighty will grant our military supreme success in its missions, protect its men and women from all harm, and bring them all safely back into the arms of their families and loved ones. May God bless them and that nation which they serve, Amen!






