If you are an annual member and have not paid your dues, you are not in good standing with your Pup Tent, your Grand or with Supreme. Cooties we need to grow, without new members we are going to eventually fail in our mission to "Keep'em Smiling in beds of White."

We have selected the Marriott Hotel and Resort Airport in St. Louis, MO for our Supreme Convention in July. The registration, banquet and hotel information is available on our website. Reserve your rooms early. Those of you that want a hospitality room contact Supreme Headquarters to get the specifics on the rooms. They are as usual first come first served. Remember that every Pup Tent must register at least one delegate to the Supreme Convention at a cost of \$15.00 per delegate. You can of course pay at the door (convention) but it will cost you \$17.00 to do so.

From the Supreme Surgeon

#### Cooties,

I hope you and your family had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year celebration. This year, let us keep our life's goals in mind and make our health a priority.

Think about how many of these goals depend on your being healthy. Whether you want to take a well deserved vacation, plan a family gathering, or just stick around to play with your grandchildren, you want to stay well. The best way to do that is by getting regular medical care, something many men neglect.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, women are much more likely than men to visit their doctors each year. This means men miss out on care that could detect serious diseases. 50 percent more men than women die of cancer and men are twice as likely as women to die from heart disease. Many men don't want to admit they feel bad and are reluctant to seek help.

Seeing a doctor helps ensure you will receive important screening, such as blood pressure and cholesterol tests. An appointment is also a good time to discuss other tests that might be helpful. These may include: diabetes, colorectal cancer and prostate cancer screenings.

#### Reduce your risk for high blood pressure.

The following are some important health tips to reduce the risk for high blood pressure:

Eating a healthy diet can reduce your risk for high blood pressure. It will also help lower elevated levels.

#### The National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute recommend the following tips:

- Eat two to three servings of low fat dairy products daily.
- Include eight to 10 servings of fruits and vegetables every day.
- Include whole-grain breads and cereals into your diet.
- Eat nuts, seeds and beans four to five times a week.
- Limit fats and oils to two to three times a week.
- Limit sweets to no more than five per week.
- Choose low-fat meats, poultry and fish.

#### **A Cootie Request**

As we remember our veterans this month and throughout the year, sometimes a special request will come in from members and or family. I would like to share this story and the help that was given to make a WWII veteran feel good.

#### The Request

As I was sitting at the computer I was notified that someone (PSC Gerald Constable) had commented on Facebook and referenced me. I reviewed the comments and found this request on the MOC/MOCA COOTIES Facebook page from a MOCA member (Faye Webb Caldwell) from Pup Tent 4 Fiddlers of the Grand of Delaware.

"Please pardon my request. Are there any Cooties/MOCA in our FB group who are in West Virginia and visit the VA Hospital in Martinsburg, West VA? My 90 mother-in-law is a WW II Vet - Navy Nurse who has been transferred to the Hospice unit for palliative care at the VA hospital. In fact she is one of two lady WWII vets in the hospice wing. Just wondering if any Cooties up that way can make a visit to keep her smiling in beds of white?"

#### The Mission

I contacted a couple of new Cooties, Phil Rusciolelli and Stanley Dixon, from Pup Tent 14 Grand of VA, who make visits to the VA Hospital in Martinsburg. I asked if they could possibly make a trip out to Martinsburg, West VA and see this vet. I put cootie Phil Rusciolelli in contact with Faye and here is the rest of the story.

Cooties, Phil Rusciolelli and Stanley Dixon planned their trip from Loudon County VFW Post 1177, as did MOCA member Caldwell from MOCA 4 Fiddlers, Grand of Delaware. The weather for this week has called for snow, rain and ice all along the eastern coast and could hamper Ms. Caldwell and the cooties from Pup Tent 14, but it was all a go.

#### The Completion of the Mission

This was posted by Cootie Caldwell on the MOC/MOCA COOTIES Facebook (FB) page. "On this Thanksgiving day, I wanted to say how thankful I am for my MOC and MOCA. On Thanksgiving Eve I drove from Delaware to the VA Hospital in Martinsburg, West VA. in the snow, wind and rain to visit my mother-in-law, a WW II Navy Nurse in the hospice at the VA medical center. I was feeling sad because I had nothing to bring her and feeling that this may be the last time I see her.

As I sat talking with her I received a phone call from two Cooties who said they had made the trip from Leesburg, VA to the hospital in answer to a request I had made on FB this past week. - 1. Pup Tents, Districts, Grand's, and Auxiliaries are reminded that they are to file IRS Form 990 within five months and fifteen days of the close of their fiscal year. Units whose income for 2013 was less than \$50,000.00 can elect to file Form 990-N an electronic informational return instead of a paper return. Those units whose income was over \$50,000.00 will still have to file the regular Form 990 or 990-T.
- 2. Cooties at all levels are reminded that Cootie Sunday this year is 16 February 2014. All Cooties should make special effort to visit our hospitalized Veterans on this date.
- 3. Pup Tents are reminded that Supreme By-Laws state that Pup Tents shall elect their Shave tails no sooner than 15 January 2014. Election and installation must be completed and the Election Report mailed to Supreme Headquarters no later than 31 March 2014. Pup Tents who cannot fulfill this obligation must have approval of the Grand Commander for extension of the time beyond the deadline. Pup Tents not in a Grand must have the approval of the Supreme Commander to extend the time to elect and install.
- 4. The Pup Tent Election Report Form is available on the website www.lotcs.org under the heading Forms, than under the heading Pup Tents. Download the Form and fill it out and either mail or e-mail the completed form to Supreme Headquarters.
- 5. Supreme By-Laws section 314 and 413 Paragraph G requires that the office of CCDB/ Quartermaster be bonded for the amount of the liquid assets normally held in the checking accounts of the Pup Tent or Grand. The following Pup Tents have failed to bond the office of CCDB as of 31 December 2013 and are in arrears to the Supreme Organization and are therefore suspended until bonds have been procured. CO 007; CT 005; EU Grand; FL 003, 043, 065, 088; IL 078; IN Grand; KS 002; KY 010; LA 014; MA 034; MO 056; ND 006,007; NJ 059; OH 045; OK 001, 002, 004, 017; PA 026, 034, 039, 048, 057; SC 003, 005; TN 017; TX 069; WA 001. Grand Commanders are directed to contact these Pup Tents and bring them into compliance with Supreme By-Law directives. Subordinate units of the MOC are required to provide proof of suitable bonding.
- 6. In accordance with Supreme Policy, all Grand's are to inform Supreme Headquarters of the dates and places of their Grand Scratch so that proper representation may be assigned. Completed forms are to be mailed to Supreme Headquarters no later 14 February 2014. failed to submit an election report to the Supreme Adjutant and are therefore suspended until a proper election report is submitted: CO 010; CT 005; FL 003, 065, 088; MA 034; NJ 059; OH 031, 086; OK 001, 017; PA 026, 057; WA 001.

In accordance with Supreme By-Laws Section 505 Paragraph B and Section 509 Paragraph A; the Supreme Commander has removed the appointment of Jesse Kitson as Supreme Editor and has made the following appointments: Dale lannello Supreme Editor; Hal Roesch Supreme Bouncer; Rainey (the service dog) Supreme Command Dog. - 10. AUXILIARIES ON ALL LEVELS: must have their own EIN for the purpose of maintaining their non-profit status under the umbrella of the Supreme Organization. This number is to be provided to the Supreme Quartermaster, 604 Braddock Avenue, Turtle Creek, PA 15145.





He has always volunteered with the VFW, Cooties, and Boy Scouts. What a life this man has spent, caring and giving. His stories made the trip enjoyable and fun. We all send our prayers to John Adams in his recovery, but, will always remember our detour from Louisville to Baltimore to Turtle Creek in 14 hours.
