

### **MOC GENERAL ORDERS #2**

- Pup Tents, Districts, Grands, and Auxiliaries are reminded that they are to file IRS Form 990 within three months and fifteen days of the close of their fiscal year. Units whose income for 2011 was less than \$25,000.00 can elect to file Form 990-N an electronic informational return instead of a paper return. hose units whose income was over \$25,000.00 will still have to file the regular Form 990 or 990T.
- Cooties at all levels are reminded that Cootie
  Sunday this year is 12 February 2012. All
  Cooties should make a special effort to visit
  our hospitalized veterans on this date.
- 3. Pup Tents are reminded that Supreme By-Laws state that Pup Tents shall elect their Shavetails no sooner than 15 January 2012. Election and installation must be completed and the Election Report mailed to Supreme Headquarters no later than 31 March 2012. Pup Tents who cannot fulfill this obligation must have approval of the Grand Commander for extension of the time beyond the deadline. Pup Tents not in a Grand must have the approval of the Supreme Commander to extend the time to elect and install.
- 4. The Pup Tent Election Report Form is available on the website www.lotcs.org under the heading Forms, than under the heading Pup Tents. Download the form and fill it out and either mail or e-mail the completed form to Supreme Headquarters.
- 5. Supreme By-Laws Sections 314 and 413 Paragraph G require that the office of CCDB/ Quartermaster be bonded for the amount of the liquid assets normally held in the checking accounts of the Pup Tent or Grand. The following Pup Tents have failed to

bond the office of CCDB as of 15 December 2011 and are in arrears to the Supreme Organization and are therefore suspended until bonds have been procured: AL: All Pup Tents including the Grand; CT: 5, 14; EU Grand, 8, 12; FL: 6, 37, 63, 65; IL: Grand, 37, 66, 67, 78, 81, 82; IN: 1, 16, 24; LA: 3, 20, 22; MD: 2, 13, 16; MN: 17, 26, 65; MS: 4, 6, 10, 11, 16; NE: Grand, 1, 4, 8; NH: Grand; NY: 3, 6, 55; NC: 57; ND: 1, 2, 12; OH: 4, 6, 10, 11, 20, 48,

- 70; OK: Grand, 2, 6, 16, 17; OR: 4, 6, 15; PA: 24, 33, 38, 50, 77; SC: Grand, 2, 3; SD: 1; TX: 6, 11, 27, 36, 47; WA: 1; WI: 15, 33; and WY: 1. Grand Commanders are directed to contact these Pup Tents and bring them into compliance with Supreme By-Law directives. Subordinate units of the MOC are required to provide proof of suitable bonding.
- 6. In accordance with Supreme Policy, all Grands are to inform the Supreme Headquarters of the dates and places of their Grand Scratch so that proper representation may be assigned. Completed forms are to be mailed to Supreme Headquarters no later than 31 January 2012.
- 7. As per a decision made by the Supreme Council of Administration on 05 November 2011, The Cootie Courier will be distributed electronically only, starting with the July 2012 issue. There will be forms available in this edition of the Courier for those that have no means to receive the Courier electronically. If you absolutely must have the Courier in print, you must fill out the form and mail it to Supreme Headquarters.
- 8. Supreme By-Laws Section 533 requires that each Pup Tent register at least one delegate for the Supreme Convention. The following Pup Tents have failed to register a delegate as of 15 December 2011 and are now in arrears to the Supreme Organization and are therefore suspended until compliance with Supreme By-Laws are met: AL: 5, 11; AK: 3; AZ: 13; CO: 1, 27; CT: 5, 14; EU: 8, 12; FL: 3, 6, 19, 37, 55, 63, 65, 77, 78, 81, 88, 92; GA: 4; IL: 32, 42, 66, 67, 78, 81; IN: 1,16, 24; KY: 4, 5; LA: 13, 22; MD: 2, 13, 16; MI: 7, 11, 13, 29; MN: 15, 17, 26, 45, 53, 54, 63, 65, 88;

- In accordance with Supreme By-Laws Section 308 paragraph B - The installing officer shall forward immediately after installation, a report, properly signed to the Supreme Adjutant and to the Grand Adjutant where a Grand Pup Tent exists. The following Pup Tents have failed to submit an election report to the Supreme Adjutant and are therefore suspended until a proper election report is submitted: AL: 5, 11, 13; CT: 5, 14; EU: 8; FL: 6, 78; IA: 16; IL: 66; IN: 1; MD: 2, 4, 13; MS: 4, 6, 10, 16; ND: 1, 5; NE 1; NH: 12; OH: 10, 11, 20, 48, 60, 70, 71; PA: 14, 24, 33, 38, 50, 77; SC: 2; WY: 1. The following Grands are therefore suspended for failure to comply with Supreme By-Laws Section 408 paragraph C - The installing officer shall forward immediately after installation, a report, properly signed, to the Supreme Adjutant: NH.
- 10. All Pup Tents are reminded that ALL continuous members that have failed to pay their dues by 31 December 2011 are no longer members in good standing.

## MESSAGE FROM THE SUPREME SURGEON

Cooties, I hope you and your family had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year celebration. This year, let us keep our life's goals in mind and make our health a priority.

Think about how many of these goals depend on your being healthy. Whether you want to take a well-deserved vacation, plan a family gathering, or just stick around to play with your grandchildren – you want to stay well. The best way to do that is by getting regular medical care – something many men neglect.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, women are much more likely than men to visit their doctors each year. This means men miss out on care that could detect serious diseases. fifty percent more men than women die of cancer; and men are twice as likely as women to die from heart disease. Many men don't want to admit they feel bad, and are reluctant to seek help.

Seeing a doctor helps ensure you will receive important screening, such as blood pressure and cholesterol tests. An appointment is also a good time to discuss other tests that might be helpful. These may include: diabetes, colon-rectal cancer and prostate cancer screenings.

The following are some important health tips to reduce the risk for high blood pressure. Eating a healthy diet can reduce your risk for high blood pressure; it will also help lower elevated levels.

The National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute recommend the following tips:

- Eat two/three servings of low fat dairy products daily.
- Include eight to 10 servings of fruits and vegetables every day.
- Choose low-fat meats, poultry and fish.



- Include whole-grain breads and cereals into your diet.
- Eat nuts, seeds and beans four to five times a week.
- Limit fats and oils to two to three times a week.
- Limit sweets to no more than five per week.

# A COOTIE FRIEND IN GERMANY

What can one say about Cootie William E. Lally? Cootie Bill is a good friend and a Cootie who should be emulated!

Bill has held many, many offices in the VFW, being one of the original and charter members of Post 9348, but it is his dedication to the Military Order of the Cootie where he is outstanding. Bill was the Seam Squirrel for Pup Tent 2 in 1980 as well as being the All\*Star Seam Squirrel for 1980-1981. Also in 1980-1981 he was the District 2 Commander for Southern Germany. In 1981-1982 he was the Grand Judge Advocate while also being the Acting Department Commander of Germany and the Chairman of the Audit Committee for Southern Germany. Still in 1981-1982 he became a Supreme Deputy Chief of Staff. Then in 1983, he was District 2 Chaplain and Service Officer and also the Deputy Inspector for Southern Germany.

I suppose I could go on and on, but you surely get the idea! Today, Cootie Bill is a MAL and remains a dedicated Cootie.

Bill is married to Ursula and they have two daughters, Patricia who currently resides in Colorado Springs, and Linda who resides in Germany, and two grandchildren.



### **INTERESTING FACTS**

#### **Armistice Day Becomes Veterans Day**

World War I officially ended on 28 June 1919, with the signing of the Treaty of Versailles. The actual fighting between the Allies and Germany, however, had ended seven months earlier with the armistice, which went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month in 1918. Armistice Day, as November 11 became known, officially became a holiday in the United States in 1926, and a national holiday 12 years later. On 01 June 1954, the name was changed to Veterans Day to honor all U.S. veterans.

In 1968, new legislation changed the national commemoration of Veterans Day to the fourth Monday in October. It soon became apparent, however, that November 11 was a date of historic significance to many Americans. Therefore, in 1978 Congress returned the observance to its traditional date.



#### **Tomb of the Unknowns**

Official, national ceremonies for Veterans Day center around the Tomb of the Unknowns. To honor these men, symbolic of all Americans who gave their lives in all wars, an Army honor guard, the 3d U.S. Infantry (The Old Guard), keeps day and night vigil.

At 11 a.m. on November 11, a combined color guard representing all military services executes "Present Arms" at the tomb. The nation's  $\frac{1}{2}$ 

tribute to its war dead is symbolized by the laying of a presidential wreath and the playing of "TAPS."



#### **Unknown Soldier Identified**

On Memorial Day (which honors U.S. service people who died in action) in 1958, two more unidentified American war dead, one from World War II and the other from the Korean War, were buried next the unknown soldier of World War I.

A law was passed in 1973 providing interment of an unknown American from the Vietnam War, but because of the improved technology to identify the dead, it was not until 1984 that an unidentified soldier was buried in the tomb.

In 1998, however, the Vietnam soldier was identified through DNA tests as Michael Blassie, a 24-year-old Air Force pilot who was shot down in May of 1972 near the Cambodian border. His body was disinterred and reburied by his family in St. Louis, Missouri.

### **GRAND OF ARIZONA**




