

## Bringing the Eyes of Freedom to your community illustrates your commitment to the Veteran Community.

### Our story...

In the Spring of 2006, L. Co. of Lima Company was deployed to Iraq. Twenty two Marines and one Navy Corpsman were killed in action between May and August of that year. The news of their losses hit central Ohio and prompted spontaneous expressions of compassion for the families of the fallen and the surviving Marines, and as a result, The Eyes of Freedom was born. As a not-profit, it is our mission to provide continued support to the families of Lima Company and Veterans nationwide. The Eyes of Freedom functions as a traveling memorial across the United States, dedicated to honoring the service and sacrifice of all who answer our nation's call, ensuring that those who gave the ultimate sacrifice are never forgotten.

The Eyes of Freedom traveling memorial includes portraits of our fallen from Lima Company along with the sculpture 'Silent Battle' created by Anita Miller. 'Silent Battle' was created after witnessing first hand the struggles of our returning combat veterans coping with post traumatic stress and the loss of their brothers and sisters in combat and at home. Survivor guilt, grief, and trauma often run deeper than words. Art reaches the recess of the heart and creates the connections that can break the cycle of pain. 'Silent Battle' initiates the tough conversations about veteran PTSD with the purpose of supporting our veterans and making sure their voices are heard.




# SILENT BATTLE



The life-sized bronze sculpture depicts a gladiating warrior treading the dog trap of his friend. We encourage visitors to touch and interact with the sculpture in whatever way their legs desire. Before our ship each event, the bronze is initially cleaned and prepared to become a canvas for healing, transformation and restoration.

Shed Boots sits on a set of octagonal rolling legs. Dog tags and sharpie markers are provided for the ability to leave a permanent message of their journey.



**The Eyes of Freedom paintings can be displayed in many layouts; however an octagon is preferred.**




**Eight paintings measure:**
