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













From the Supreme Seam Squirrel


Lousy salutations Cooties!

WOW, it's already October—where has the year gone? As we dive into the new month, we've got some important updates on bonds, membership, and upcoming events.

Bond Season Is Here!

A huge thank you to all the Grands and Pup Tents that have already paid your **Two-Year Security (2025-2027) Bond**.

If you haven't yet, you can find the application forms on our website under **lotcs.org > Forms > CCDB**. Bonds are still \$14 per \$1,000. Please remember to complete a separate questionnaire for each position you wish to cover (CCDB or Seam Squirrel). For more details, refer to **By-Laws Section 314 G**.



If your Pup Tent decides not to hold a bond, you must send a copy of the Scratch minutes that record the membership vote to HQ's. Pup Tent CCDBs **cannot** make this decision without membership input!

2025-2026 Membership Reminders

We are four months into the new year, and by now, all Pup Tent CCDBs should have received their Annual Membership Cards from the Grand CCDB.

- If you are a Pup Tent CCDB and haven't received your cards, please let me know.
- If you are an Independent Pup Tent CCDB, your cards were sent directly from HQs. If you haven't received them, please contact me.

Now is the time to check your 2025-2026 Election Reports for any **EXPIRED** Annual Members and get their renewals in! To be in good standing and hold an elected position, send the renewal to HQs immediately.

Section 112, Members in Good Standing, states: A duly elected and obligated member ceases to be in good standing immediately upon the expiration of the period for which their dues are paid or remitted in either the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States or the Military Order of the Cootie.

How Do Transmittals (TRs) Work?

This is a great question! Here's a quick breakdown of the process:

- Pup Tent (PT) CCDBs collect dues from annual and new members.
- Complete the Pup Tent TR, include the Grand Per Capita Tax and Supreme Per Capita Tax, write a check, and send it to the Grand CCDB. If there are new members, also include the New Cootie Application.
- Grand CCDBs receive the PT TR, and record the new members.
- Complete a Grand TR, including the Supreme's PCT, write a check, and send it to Supreme. Be sure to include a copy of the New Cootie Applications.

From the Supreme Surgeon

Greetings Lousy Comrades,

I hope all you had a very Lousy summer and you enjoyed all things Cootie.

Veteran suicide is still a very big issue for all Veterans of all ages. This article from the September 21st issue of VA News has a very good article by Amanda Lienau.

A text from someone just to check in. A call from a loved one who noticed you moved your firearm. A conversation with new friends who understand your experience. These small moments of connection are at the heart of suicide prevention and can add up to make a big impact.



This year, VA is launching seven new programs that create more of these moments for Veterans — especially those not yet connected with VA care.

Meeting Veterans where they are.

These new programs come from VA's Mission Daybreak, which finds and supports innovative ways to prevent Veteran suicide. The effort recognizes a critical gap: Nearly 50% of Veterans who died by suicide in 2022 had not received VA services that year or the year before.

But suicide rates have fallen among Veterans in Veterans Health Administration (VHA) care with mental health diagnoses. These new programs extend that protection by meeting Veterans in community spaces and through technology, giving Veterans more choices for connecting with support in their homes, on their phones and among their peers.

Seven new ways to connect

Each initiative takes a different approach to reducing suicide risk.

- → Anonymous peer groups. Veterans can join safe, professionally moderated online groups without sharing personal information. One Veteran user said: "The moderator was wonderful. I feel better now than before I joined the group!" Cabana's platform makes it easier to access mental health care without facing common barriers like stigma, privacy concerns or location.
- > Enhanced check-ins. NeuroFlow makes mental health care easier for Veterans. It

helps VA clinicians stay up to date on how Veterans are doing and support those who need it most. The software provides more patient insights, creates smoother workflows and reduces administrative burden.

- → Smartphone wellness insights. Behavidence's platform helps Veterans identify behavioral changes linked to suicide risk and PTSD. With a user's permission, this app provides continuous insights based on smartphone usage patterns to supplement and enhance existing mental health screenings and appointments with clinicians.
- → **Talking circles.** By using **Televeda's** platform, American Indian and Alaska Native Veterans can join digital talking circles that incorporate traditional healing practices with storytelling, peer support and evidence-based mental health care. "Veterans helping Veterans has been the most effective form of support," shared one Veteran who participated in digital talking circles. "These circles give us space to discuss our military experiences in ways that family and friends may not fully understand."
- → Firearm safety alerts. With Regal Products, Veterans and trusted contacts receive automated alerts about any firearm movement, powered by a motion detector inside a cable gun lock. These real-time alerts, sent through a mobile app, help friends and loved ones check in with a Veteran during a potential moment of suicidal crisis, addressing one of the most common methods of Veteran suicide.
- → Low-pressure wellness checks. Circles of Support sends automated wellness text messages to build trust with non-VHA-connected Veterans and link them to VA services. The messages ask Veterans simple questions about their well-being and mood, then direct them to resources relevant to their replies.
- → Augmented suicide prevention training. Customer Value Partners (CVP) provides VA staff with a training system that uses virtual reality (VR) to simulate real Veteran interactions and scenarios. By combining VR with AI-based coaching and feedback, the tool empowers VA staff — including non-mental health care specialists — to recognize signs of suicide risk in a safe and realistic environment.

YOUR VOICE MATTERS

More than 500 Veterans, spouses and experts have helped shape these programs through collaborative design and development. Veterans will continue to provide feedback on these programs as they evolve over the coming year. If you are interested in supporting these efforts or learning more, visit **Mission Daybreak**.

Hi Cooties,


As we begin a Cootie year, I trust you are all Cootie Crummy.



When will it be used?	It will be very useful in identifying your current health issue(s) if you find yourself in a medical emergency. It will help you quickly inform Emergency Room medical professionals of important medication sensitivities in your health condition. Present this card any time you are hospitalized, require emergency medical care, or meet with a new physician for the first time. Carry it in your wallet.
Where can it be used?	It can be used while you are staying in the Philippines or traveling elsewhere.
Why we could use this Medical Alert Card (MAC)?	We will never know what could happen to us if we are hospitalized at any given moment or time.

The MAC can be a very important and valuable asset to you when you travel. This is free of charge and will not have any hidden cost. If you are interested in this MAC, please feel free to send me a message thru my contact information below. I would be extremely appreciate it if this MAC program can reach all of our Cooties here in the Philippines.

Looking forward to assisting you and making your stay in this part of the world safe, or anywhere else in the world.
